Conlon Memorial Garden

Donors, Jim and Carol Conlon, worked with the landscaping consultants Stephen Jackson and Candace Currie from Garden GIS over the course of the summer to finalize the planting and hardscape features. This fall the seating wall will be built and in the spring of 2023 the plants and trees will be planted. The Memorial Garden will connect our Columbarium with our Boulder Garden and provide a place of respite for people, a healthy habitat for the animals and insects, as well as an area where families can hold memorial services and the cemetery can host programming. We are grateful for the Conlon's generosity.

Grant work

The Wildwood Executive Board is in the process of setting up a **Friends of Wildwood Cemetery 501c3**. In the meantime, we have applied for Town of Amherst CPA funds to put towards the preservation of the Dickinson Farmhouse roof and chimneys. Hopefully by our Spring newsletter we will have good news concerning this project.

It offers a way to honor or remember a family member or special person by dedicating a tree as a living tribute. Options will vary depending on the current horticulture plan at the time of tribute. 5 years - \$2500 or 15 years - \$5000.
